



College and career ready reading and writing in career-technical fields requires students to be able to gain knowledge from challenging manuals and technical texts that often make extensive use of elaborate diagrams and data to convey information and illustrate concepts. Students must be able to read complex informational texts in these fields with independence and confidence, because the vast majority of reading in college and workforce training programs will be high-level nonfiction.
