3. Why are you initiating a contract?

The University of North Carolina TEACCH Autism Program developed the intervention approach called "Structured TEACCHing", an evidenced based practice for teaching individuals with autism spectrum disorders. This evidence based approach is based on

understanding the learning characteristics of individuals with autism and the use of visual supports to promote meaning, flexibility, and independence. TEACCH structured teaching is supported by empirical research, enriched by extensive clinical expertise, and notable for its flexible and individualized support of individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and their families. TEACCH currently provides a variety of trainings focused on helping educators understand the learning styles of autism, the process of assessment and strategies for teaching skills based on information learned about the individual with ASD.

The Exceptional Children Division is committed to offering professional development to support personnel in NC public schools who work with students with autism. This contract will specifically provide foundational evidence based practices that when implemented will increase the school success of students with autism.

What services will you require?

- Implementation of eight 3 day trainings and six 2- day trainings for coaches (36 total training days), in conjunction with DPI Autism Consultants
- Training necessary for NCDPI AU consultants to achieve the required certification level to be active trainers
- 4. How does the contract add value to the teaching/learning process? Teachers and administrators working with students with autism require professional development opportunities to understand how to develop and implement comprehensive, effective academic, behavioral, and social interventions. TEACCH created the Structured Teaching evidence-based practice and provides trainings that explicitly teach educators how to identify the underlying characteristics affecting an individual with autism and their unique learning style. The TEACCH evidence based practice will increase NC school personnel's ability to create effective educational programs with students with autism spectrum disorders.
- 5. Is the service unique and not repetitive with agency activity or other contracts? Please state why this service cannot be performed within the resources of the agency. TEACCH is led by national experts in the field of autism and is regarded as a leading authority in research and implementing interventions for people with autism. Additionally, TEACCH is known internationally for their advances in the education and treatment of people with autism. This University-based program has been serving families, people with autism, and classrooms designed for children with autism, since they were funded by the state legislature in 1971.
- 6. What is the impact, if you do not contract for these services? There is a growing population of students with autism being served in our school systems as well as high turn-over of teachers who teach students with autism. These students require specialized instruction. As a Division, we need to provide this foundational knowledge; if we do not contract with TEACCH, the EC Division's 3 AU consultants will need to provide this training. This will limit the time these consultants have to offer additional needed professional development across the state, provide technical assistance, conduct program reviews, attend meetings and provide advanced trainings and support for autism problem teams.
